Cr Kylie Spears new Mayor for 2023/24

Cr Kylie Spears was elected as Maroondah's 28th Mayor during a special Council meeting livestreamed to the Maroondah community. This is Cr Spears' second term as Mayor.

Cr Spears will be supported by Cr Paul Macdonald, who was elected to the role of Deputy Mayor. It is the first time he has held this position, which will provide support to the Mayor in a busy year ahead for Council.

"Representing the community is a privilege and I'm very much looking forward to doing so with energy, passion, commitment and integrity," Cr Spears said.

"I'd like to thank my fellow Councillors for entrusting me to lead this Council and our vibrant and diverse City. Together I know we will continue to achieve the aspirations of our community and our collective goals."

Cr Spears thanked the outgoing Mayor, Cr Rob Steane OAM, for his strong leadership, commitment and enthusiasm for the Maroondah community over the past twelve months, and outgoing Deputy Mayor, CrTasa Damante, for her support of the Councillor team.

As we enter the fourth year of this current Council term, Cr Spears looks forward to continuing and completing many of the projects envisioned back in 2020, and also starting some of the new projects aligned with the *Council Plan 2021-2025* and *Maroondah 2040*.

"This year will provide our community with one of the most important opportunities to shape Maroondah, as we consult on the next horizon of Maroondah 2050. We will be looking to the future, to review and develop a new community vision, consulting and working with our community, key stakeholders and partners to ensure that the new Maroondah 2050 vision captures the hopes and aspirations of all of us," Cr Spears said.

Be aware of asbestos

November is National Asbestos Awareness Month.

This highlights the dangers of asbestos-containing materials and aims to prevent asbestos-related diseases through awareness and education

Fibres that make up asbestos are tiny but strong. When asbestos fibres are breathed in, they may remain deep within the lungs. They can lodge in lung tissue and cause inflammation, scarring, lung cancer and other asbestos-related diseases, which usually take many years to develop.

Materials that can contain asbestos include parts of buildings, cars, fibre cement sheeting and piping, vinvl floor tiles, electrical parts, brake pads in vehicles and more.

On behalf of Council and our Councillors, we wish all Maroondah residents a very happy and safe festive season.

If you are travelling over the summer break, please take care and stay safe on the roads. You can use the Victorian Government's Asbestos in Victoria website www.asbestos.vic.gov.au to learn more about identifying and managing asbestos safely. The site includes an interactive tool to guide you through possible locations for asbestos and provides practical guidance on how to safely manage or remove it.

If you suspect asbestos, do not touch it. It is a risk to your health, your family's health and the health of your community.

COVID-19 Update

2023 boosters

If it's been six months since your last COVID-19 vaccination or COVID-19 infection, you may be eligible to receive your 2023 booster.

Protect yourself and others

You can help protect yourself and others by wearing a high-quality, well-fitted face mask when unwell, receiving the 2023 booster, letting fresh air in when indoors and taking a rapid antigen test (RAT) if you have symptoms. If you have COVID-19, you should stay home for five days and continue to stay home until you have no symptoms.

Free rapid antigen tests

The Victorian Government is providing free rapid antigen tests (RATs) to our community. These are available at Council's Realm and Croydon Customer Service Centres. Visit Council's website for details.

Stay safe in the heat

Heat-related illness can affect anybody. Learn how to protect yourself and others.

During extreme heat, drink plenty of water, take it easy and stay indoors. If you need to go out, wear a hat and sunscreen and stay in the shade. Never leave children, older people or pets in cars, as cars can heat to dangerous temperatures quickly.

Council services and appointments

If the Chief Health Officer issues a Heat Health Warning, some regular Council services may be reduced or cancelled to protect vulnerable community members.

Council will contact those impacted. You can also call us on 1300 88 22 33 if you are unsure.

Power outages

If your power goes out, contact your electricity distributor and use the AusNet Services Outage Tracker www.outagetracker.com.au to stay up to date.

Food safety

The most important thing during a power outage is to try to keep food cold or frozen. If food is still cold to the touch (less than 5° C), it is safe to use.

Before and after a power failure:

- Once cold or frozen food is no longer cold to the touch, it can be kept and eaten for up to four hours and then it must be thrown away. If it is raw meat, it should be cooked before it is eaten.
- Eat hot food within four hours of it being heated or throw it away.
- If power is restored when frozen food is still frozen solid, the food is safe.

New life for pizza boxes

Did you know that empty pizza boxes can go in your blue-lidded recycling bin?



Council's recycling processor now has Australia's first drum pulper, which will help keep even more cardboard out of landfill and turn it into new packaging, including new pizza boxes.

Make sure the boxes are empty before you place them in your recycling bin. The recycling process will remove small amounts of grease or crumbs. You can also place these items in your recycling bin:

- other cardboard and paper
- hard plastic bottles and containers
- glass bottles and jars
- steel cans
- aluminium cans and foil
- aerosols.

You can tear and crush large cardboard pieces to save space and help prevent the cardboard from becoming stuck in your bin or in the truck.

Remember to put your items in your recycling bin loosely, not bagged, as plastic bags cannot be recycled by Council's recycler and can damage the machinery.
