You can have fun on the climbing frames.







If you get tired you can sit down and have a rest.

You can take your bike with you and practice on the learner's bike track.




There is a bbq at the picnic area so you may like to cook your own lunch.

Notes for parents



This park was chosen as it is a large, quiet community space with various types of play equipment. It has a car park and is located next to the Glen Park Community Centre. The centre has a café, open Monday to Friday from 9am to 4pm. There is a toilet block near the community centre, visible from the playground.

There is also a learner's bike track with different textured surfaces and mini road signs, and an oval so there is lots of space for other activities.

Please note the playground area is quite open so you are advised to take hats/sunscreen etc for your children and a drink.



There is a special toddler's area close to the shade shelter with:

- slides
- swings
- animals
- bongo drums
- spinning disc.

For older children, there is a wide range of rope climbing challenges including:

- 6m high pyramid net
- ropes course
- spinning poles
- basket swing.

Next to the playground are free tennis and

basketball courts - BYO equipment. The playground is connected to the Dandenong Creek Trail for easy walking and cycling access.

There are also some walking tracks around the community space.
